The Sunday before Thanksgiving I left for a quick trip to Honduras. I was able to return Wednesday night just in time to celebrate Thanksgiving with my extended family on Thursday. During those few days in between, I learned how God has been working throughout the whole year in Honduras.

Very early on Monday morning, Pastor Carlos (the national ministry leader) and Kike (our friend, driver and translator) took me to meet Pastor Juventino and Santos and Wendy, the family that I shared about in our last prayer letter. I was able to meet them, see the house that is being constructed and hear the story of how they trusted in Jesus. It was a very special meeting that I will never forget. It was well worth the seven-hour round-trip.

Back in the spring of 2021, Pastor Joel was ready to walk away from serving the church and sharing the gospel in the village of Cerro Grande. He had been there five years and was discouraged with the lack of spiritual fruit. In addition, the aftereffects of the hurricane that blew through the community in the late fall of 2020 took its toll on the already deteriorating church building.

On Tuesday, I was able to have a meeting with Rodimiro, one of the coffee farmers from who we buy our Honduran coffee, about our 2022 crop of coffee. God answered our prayers as we found a good solution to a problem with exporting that had surfaced over the last year or so. We are so thankful for the body of Christ and how we can work together for His glory.
